Catriona takes over the Presidency from the very distinguished Maurizio d'Amico who has served the Institution and held its core beliefs to a very high standard over the last two years, we thank him for his support and wish him well for the future.

Maurizio d'Amico had these words about his tenure as President and in welcoming Catriona as the new president of RINA.
