In April 2018, IMO members agreed on a target to cut the shipping sector's overall CO2 output by 50% by 2050 compared to 2008. If the size of international shipping doubles by 2050, each ship will need to emit ~25% greenhouse gases at the 2008 reference. Such a reduction cannot be achieved through the use of energy saving technologies alone; alternative mechanisms such as future fuels could be an option to still meet this target.

In this debate we will discuss five of the most discussed fuel/energy options, Hydrogen, Ammonia, Methanol, LNG and Nuclear. We will start with a high-level overview of the different fuel areas for general information and follow up with an open debate with an expert panel and the audience.
