In 1989 IMO Resolution A.673(16) Guidelines for the Transport and Handling of Limited Amounts of Hazardous and Noxious Liquid Substances in bulk on Offshore Support Vessels.

The changes to the Chemical Code on 1 January 2007 which made major changes to the pollution aspects, which suddenly increased dramatically the number of vessels affected.

Updated requirements to carry more safety cargoes with larger quantities resulted in IMO Resolution A.1122(30) Code for the Transport and Handling of Hazardous and Noxious Liquid Substances in bulk on Offshore Support Vessels (OSV Chemical Code) came into effect in 2018. The changes to the Chemical Code on 1 January 2021 which made major changes to the safety aspects. European Flags have had to look how this is implemented on their existing vessels.
