Technical Lecture Cyber Security in Shipping

Background: Over the last few years, there has been a rapid rise in the number of reported cyber-attacks targeting the maritime sector. All four of the world's largest shipping companies have now been the target of sophisticated attacks impacting operations. Thus, with 95% of the UK's trade goods being carried by sea, it is critical that the sector gives serious consideration to its cyber security stance. Improving sectoral cyber security is only going to become more important as the sector increases its dependence on digital technology, as its moves towards a greater level of autonomy.

This talk will discuss the current state of affairs for cyber security within the sector, and how governance and technology are being used to manage the risks technology brings with it. Through the use of realistic scenarios developed within the CyberSHIP Lab, we will demonstrate the seriousness of the risks the sector faces and some of the catastrophic consequences that could occur. The talk will conclude by presenting some of the work the CyberSHIP Lab is involved in, and how this is improving the sector's cyber security stance.

His current focus is on the skills and training needed by the digital seafarer. He enjoys adopting an inter-disciplinary approach to his work, and exploring new topics and themes, these include (but not limited to) maritime security, piracy, environmental protection, sustainability and critical infrastructure protection.
