The Golden Hinde: Why Build a Replica?

Summary:

In the 1970s, a team of historians, naval architects and shipwrights undertook an unusual and ambitious project. Over a period of five years they painstakingly researched and built a full-scale and fully operational reconstruction of Francis Drake's 16th Century galleon, the Golden Hinde. Since then, the Hinde has circumnavigated the world, sailed well over a hundred-thousand miles and is now birthed as a museum ship on the south bank of the River Thames, London. For the last three years, it has been undergoing a major refit, informed by historical evidence and utilising a number of 16th century techniques and tools. The Golden Hinde provides an unparalleled insight into challenges involved in constructing a galleon in the 16th century, as well as the trials and tribulations of sailing one around the world.
