The Venue

The conference will be held at the historic premises of Lloyd's Register, 71 Fenchurch Street, London. Sessions will take place in the ornately decorated General Committee Room, the site of world-changing discussions about safety for over a hundred years. In the heart of the City, the building is close to several main underground and overground train stations, the DLR and major bus routes.

The Cause

All profit from the conference will go directly to the RNLI to fund and maintain a new Thames lifeboat. The boat will be shared between the Chiswick and Tower lifeboat station. In 2009, Tower and Chiswick lifeboat stations rescued 225 people, all without any funding from the government; the Thames lifeboats are funded purely by voluntary donations and events such as these.
