International Conference on Ship Manoeuvring in Shallow and Confined Water: Ship-to-ship Interaction 18-20 May 2011















The Second Conference on Ship Manoeuvring in Shallow and Confined Waters will add the topic of ship-to-ship cargo transfer operations to the previous themes of interaction effects in confined waters. Ship-to-ship cargo transfer operations are gaining importance as a way of improving logistics chains for both liquid and dry bulk cargos. In addition ship-to-ship operations in form of replenishment at sea operations are used by navies to keep vessels in a high state of alert condition.

One of the goals for this second conference is to follow-up challenging topics discussed at the conference in Antwerp in 2009. Bank effects on ships in channel transits as well as interaction effects between a moored and a passing vessel in port will be investigated. The conference especially invites presentations based on operational experience.

A final topic for the conference will be benchmarking of methods for calculation of interaction forces for ship-to-ship operations. The organizers of the conference have made data for two hull forms available for a benchmark study on interaction forces and moments. For these two vessels the organizers have made model test measuring interaction forces for different longitudinal and transverse separation distances of two ships when moving ahead at low constant speed.
